9. Other procedures and measures.

The system for ensuring the quality of educational activities and higher education by a higher education institution (internal quality assurance system) is evaluated by the National Agency for Higher Education Quality Assurance or accredited independent institutions for evaluating and ensuring the quality of higher education upon submission by the institution to assess its compliance with the requirements for the higher education quality assurance system approved by the National Agency for Higher Education Quality Assurance.
