### 3. FORMS OF HIGHER EDUCATION CANDIDATES' ATTESTATION

Attestation of candidates for the second (Master's) level of higher education in Specialty K 9 Law Enforcement is carried out in the form of an attestation exam. The attestation exam involves assessing the achievement of learning outcomes defined by the Higher Education Standard.

The attestation exam is a form of assessment conducted to verify the level of academic achievement according to the acquired knowledge, skills, and other competencies in line with the educational program. The exam may be conducted in oral, written, and/or testing forms.

Attestation exam programs are developed based on the higher education standards of the relevant level and specialty. According to the decisions of the responsible state authorities, such programs may be developed by the scientific and methodological commissions of the Ministry of Education and Science (MES) of Ukraine, specially formed working groups, higher education institutions, or other legal entities.

Attestation exam programs for a specialty/group of specialties are approved by the responsible state authorities and published on the official websites of such authorities and the higher education institutions that provide Master's training in that specialty (excluding restricted information).

The conditions, deadlines for task development, and assessment criteria for the attestation exam are approved by the MES of Ukraine and/or other responsible state authorities.

The higher education institution admits candidates for the Master's degree to the attestation exam provided they have no academic debt.

The assessment of the attestation exam results is carried out according to a 100-point scale, the national scale, and the ECTS scale::

Grades for the attestation exam are assigned by each member of the Examination Commission (EC). The EC's decision regarding the assessment of knowledge, the awarding of the higher education degree, and the issuance of an educational document is made in a closed session by an open majority vote of the members present. In the event of a tie, the Chairperson of the Commission has the casting vote. Retaking the attestation exam to improve a grade is not permitted.

If a candidate's performance does not meet the requirements, the EC decides that the candidate has failed the attestation, and an "Unsatisfactory" grade (0–59 points) is recorded. If a

candidate fails to appear, they are marked as "not attested due to absence." If the absence is for a valid reason (confirmed by documents), an alternative date during the EC's working period may be set.

Candidates who receive an unsatisfactory grade are dismissed from the Academy with an academic transcript of the established form. Such candidates, or those who missed the exam without a valid reason, have the right to a repeated final attestation (starting from the next academic year) within three years after dismissal.

Disputed issues regarding grades received during attestation are resolved by the Examination Commission responsible for the attestation of candidates for the respective degree.
